**Background**

Back in November 2011 the Parks and Recreation Department created a policy, that was not officially adopted by Council, to allow residents to reserve and or rent designated indoor city facilities. The indoor facilities available to rent are Old City Hall, Library Meeting Room and the Senior Center. All of these facilities are reserved on a regular basis and must be

scheduled through the Library or the Parks and Recreation Department. This resolution will establish policies and include new rules for the use of the Library's audio/visual equipment set by City Council that renters must follow when reserving the facilities.

#### Policy Considerations

This policy establishes rules and guidelines that renters must abide by when using City of Sachse indoor facilities. Reservations can only be made by Sachse residents. This policy has been reviewed by both the Parks and Recreation Board and the Library Board and they are recommending the policy to Council for approval.

#### Budgetary Considerations

There is a fee to use the Senior Center for all users. Old City Hall and the Library Meeting Room is available to non-profit organizations at no cost, while for-profit groups may use this space for a fee. All fees are listed in the Master Fee schedule and collected money will go back into the general fund.

#### Staff Recommendations

Staff recommends approval of a resolution of the City Council of the City of Sachse, Texas, adopting a policy setting forth the regulations for the rental of indoor city facilities as a Consent Agenda Item.

## RENTAL POLICIES/FACILITY USE REGULATIONS

### General

Reservations must be made by telephone or in person with the Parks and Recreation Department for use of the Old City Hall and Senior Activity Center meeting room or the Library for use of the Sachse Library meeting room. Reservations can only be made by City of Sachse residents and must be over 18 years of age. Proof of residency is required. City staff has the final approval in granting facility use for activities and reserves the right, after review to refuse future use to any group, organization or individual exhibiting a lack of regard for the policies stated within this agreement. All activities must be completed by 10:00 p.m. Reservations can only be made when the facility is available. Any exception to these rules must be designated on the "Facility Use Rental Agreement" and must be approved by staff.

### Deposits

A deposit will be collected within one business day of the time the reservation is made. Deposits will be refunded if:

- a. Rooms are vacuumed and/or swept and tables/counters are wiped down.
- b. Trash is taken to dumpster.
- c. Tables and chairs are put up and placed in their original place.
- d. The reservation ends on time. All activities must be completed by 10:00 p.m.

### Cancellation

In order to receive a full refund for a facility rental, notice must be given no less than two business days prior to the date of the rental. This shall include a full deposit refund. Refunds may be given under special circumstances when two days notice is not given at the discretion of City staff.

### Decoration

Confetti or glitter is not permitted. Nothing may be hung or taped on the walls. Any and all decorations must be approved by staff.

### Kitchen Use

Use of the kitchen is limited to use of the sink only. You must bring your own utensils, napkins, and cups, etc. The use of the facility kitchen supplies is prohibited. The use of the oven and microwave is prohibited without prior approval from City staff.

### Setup/Cleanup

Reservation times must include set-up and clean up time. Each reservation group is required to set up the tables and/or chairs and return them to their original location before departure. Each reservation group is responsible for bringing in their own cleaning supplies and trash bags. The group will be allowed to dispose of trash in the dumpster (located in the facility parking lot). A vacuum will be provided for cleanup after reservations at the Senior Center. Each reservation group must vacuum or sweep and clean/wipe all tables, countertops and ovens. All food brought in must be kept on the hard surface and will not be allowed on the carpeted area with the exception of the Old City Hall meeting room.

### Music/Noise Level

Activities generating a level of noise that interferes with other areas in use will not be permitted. Music and amplified sound should not be heard in other rooms that are in use within the building.

### Library Equipment Use

- An audio/visual projector and screen is provided for groups and/or individuals reserving the library meeting room. Laptops and/or other media devices must be provided by the renter.
- Any organization who uses the equipment to show copyrighted material without proper license will be liable for any copyright infringement.
- There is a deposit required if the library VGA and/or audio cables are checked out.

### Alcohol/Tobacco Use

The City of Sachse does not permit alcohol or permit smoking (including e-cigarettes) on or inside city property.

### Children/Youth

Adult supervision must be maintained and activities involving minors require a ratio of 1 adult to every 10 children.

### Liability

The user is liable for damages occurring during his/her use of the room. The City of Sachse accepts no liability or responsibility for any damage to persons or property arising from the use of the meeting room. Renter is required to be at event at all times.

### Rooms Available for Reservation

Rooms available for reservations are as follows (see attached fee schedule for each facility):

- a. Library Meeting Room – this room is available at no cost for regular business meetings, special meetings and programs of Sachse non-profit organizations. Other groups may hold meetings a maximum of 4 times per calendar year based on fees listed below. All reservations in this facility can be held for a maximum of 4 hours per use.
- b. Old City Hall Meeting Room- this room is available at no cost for regular business meetings, special meetings and programs of Sachse non-profit organizations. Other groups may hold meetings a maximum of 4 times per calendar year based fees listed below. All reservations in this facility can be held for a maximum of 4 hours per use.
- c. Senior Activity Center Multi-Purpose Room – this room is available for regular business meetings, special meetings and programs of Sachse non-profit organizations, as well as showers, receptions, etc. Weekday reservations require a 2 hour minimum rental (Monday-Thursday) and weekend reservations require a 4 hour minimum rental (Friday-Sunday).

Executive Summary

*The City's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) includes funds budgeted for installing street lights along State Highway 78 from Murphy Road to 5th Street. The City Council selected a lighting style for the project at the August 18, 2014 City Council Meeting. At the August 18, 2014 meeting, the City Council also provided City staff feedback on banner options to be installed on the light poles along State Highway 78. Staff has obtained additional information on banners and has worked with a vendor to prepare revised and additional banner options for discussion and consideration.*

Background

The 2011-2012 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) included a street lighting project along SH 78 from Murphy Road to 5<sup>th</sup> Street. The layout of the State Highway 78 Lighting Project is shown in Attachment A. At this time, city staff is seeking consideration for banners that would be installed on State Highway 78 as a part of the project. Once installed, the City would be responsible for the removal and installation of banners in the corridor.

Staff received preliminary comments from TxDOT on the lighting layout and is currently

working with an electrical engineering consultant on finalizing the engineering plans and construction documents for the project. Staff plans to finalize the plans and specifications for the State Highway 78 and 5th/Dewitt lighting projects, and bid the projects together. Construction is anticipated to occur next year.

Past Use of Banners: Prior to the widening of State Highway 78, the City of Sachse had street lights installed in the corridor. The City had two banners that were installed on the poles, a standard City of Sachse banner for most of the year, and a holiday-themed banner during the Christmas Season.

Banner Options: Staff has relieved digital samples of banner options for review by the City Council. The proposed light poles for the lighting projects includes an integral mounting system for banner bracket arms. Staff is seeking feedback from the City Council on the selection and location of banners to incorporate into the State Highway 78 Street Lighting project.

A three year warranty would be provided for the banners. They are expected to last up to 4-5 years, depending upon the amount of time that they are left in place.

Policy Considerations

Budgetary Considerations

### **Project Funding**

The CIP included the following funding:

- \$350,000 from RCC funds for the installation of the SH 78 street light project
- An additional \$100,000 in RCC funds is included in the 2014-15 Capital Improvement Plan for the City's Annual Operations Budget to be moved to the SH 78 lighting project. These funds were unused, as the Industrial Park lighting project was completed under budget.

### **Banner Costs**

There are volume discounts for purchasing a higher number of banners. The pricing, including shipping, for banners is as follows:

- 1 to 50 banners: \$120.00 each
- 51 to 75 banners: \$115.00 each
- 76 or more banners: \$110.00 each

Staff has prepared a budget cost estimate for the banners, based upon the primary street lighting project scope, from Bunker Hill Road to 5<sup>th</sup> Street. The additional street light segments that will be included in the project as bid alternates are from 5<sup>th</sup> Street to Williford Road, and from Williford Road to Ranch Road. A breakdown of the total banner cost for the segment from Bunker Hill Road to 5<sup>th</sup> Street is listed below:

Every Pole (23 poles - 56 banners per set)  
1 set of banners - \$5,520.00

2 sets of banners - \$10,580.00  
3 sets of banners - \$15,870.00  
4 sets of banners - \$20,240.00

Every Other Pole (12 poles - 24 banners per set)

1 set of banners - \$2,880.00  
2 sets of banners - \$5,760.00  
3 sets of banners - \$8,640.00  
4 sets of banners - \$11,520.00




The banners may be included as a bid item in the street lighting project, and the first set of banners would then be installed during the street light installation.

**Installation**

Once the initial set of banners is installed by the contractor that installs the street lights, the City of Sachse will be responsible for taking down and putting up banners throughout the year. A bucket truck will be required in order to accomplish this work. Based upon current available rental costs, a bucket truck rental is \$600.00 per day. It is anticipated that it would take 2-3 staff members one full day to put up and/or take down banners, resulting in a labor cost of approximately \$480.00 per event. This work could be outsourced to a private company that would provide the labor and equipment. Staff is seeking quotes on the anticipated cost of contracting this work out to a private company, and will provide that information upon receiving it.

**Staff Recommendations**

Staff recommends the City Council discuss and consider banner options for State Highway 78.

## Overview

- The Capital Improvement Plan includes lighting projects for State Highway 78 and 5<sup>th</sup>/Dewitt.
  - SH 78 Budget - \$350,000 (+ Additional \$100,000 in 14-15 CIP)
  - 5<sup>th</sup>/Dewitt Budget - \$310,000
- At the 8/18/14 meeting, the City Council selected the light style for both projects.
- Staff is seeking Council feedback on banners for the State Highway 78 project.


## Project Layout

- The layout of the State Highway 78 lighting will include new light poles with dual light fixtures, located in the median of State Highway 78. The limits of the project are:

- Bunker Hill Road to 5<sup>th</sup> Street
- Additional segment #1 – 5<sup>th</sup> Street to Williford Road (depending upon funds)
- Additional Segment #2 – Williford Road to Ranch Road (depending upon funds)



## Street Light Selection shown on State Highway 78



- Council selected the lighting style for the project at the August 18, 2014 Council Meeting.

## Banners

- Prior to the widening of State Highway 78, there were banners placed on the old light fixtures, including:
  - A City of Sachse banner
  - A Holiday themed banner
- The new light poles include an integral system for hanging banners

## Banner Durability

- A 3-year warranty is standard for banners
- UV Clearcoated to protect colors from fading
- Expected maximum lifespan is 4-5 years if displayed the majority of the year
- Lifespan may increase if used for short periods of time (special events)

## Banner Costs

- The banners are a 30" x 60" standard size
- There are price breaks for larger volumes of the same banner, with the following breakdown:
  - 1 to 50 banners – base price (recommended budget of \$120/banner)
  - 51 to 75 banners - \$5/banner discount
  - 76 + banners - \$10/banner discount


## Changing the Date on Banners

- Option 1
  - Printed date on a separate piece of Velcro-backed material, allowing the date to be changed on the banner
- Option 2
  - Date printed on a separate piece of banner material that is hung below the primary banner
- Cost
  - Both cost approximately \$40.00 per banner (in addition to the banner cost)






