1. Consent Agenda:

Councilwoman McMillan requested to pull Consent Agenda Item 1b. for discussion.

Councilman Timm moved to approve the Consent Agenda Item 1a. Minutes of the June 21, 2010 Regular Meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman McMillan and carried unanimously.

1b. Consider acceptance of the resignation of Animal Shelter Board Member Michael Slaughter: Following discussion, Councilwoman McMillan moved to approve Agenda Item 1b. The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem King and carried unanimously.

Consider an ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Section 10-1, Water Service Fees, by amending the water rate schedule for residential and non-residential customers; and amending Section 10-2, Sewer service fees; To provide for new rates for sewer services for residential and non-residential customers; Providing for a repealing clause; Providing a savings clause; Providing a severability clause; and Providing an effective date:

Following discussion, Mayor Pro Tem King moved to approve Ordinance No. 3223 amending the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Section 10-1, Water Service Fees, by amending the water rate schedule for residential and non-residential customers; and amending Section 10-2, Sewer service fees; To provide for new rates for sewer services for residential and non-residential customers; Providing for a repealing clause; Providing a savings clause; Providing a severability clause; and Providing an effective date for alternate 3. The motion was seconded by Councilman Timm and carried with Mayor Felix voting no.

5. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to request funds from the Sachse Economic Development Corporation to finance a sanitary sewer capital improvements plan:

Following a discussion, Councilman Adams moved to approve Resolution No. 3224 authorizing the City Manager to request funds from the Sachse Economic Development Corporation to finance a sanitary sewer capital improvements plan in an amount not to exceed \$110,000. The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem King and carried with Councilman Patterson voting no.

6. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a contract with Cobb, Fendley and Associates, Inc. for water storage tank engineering services necessary to maintain Sachse's 750,000 gallon water tower, 150,000 gallon water tower, and two metal 500,000 gallon ground storage tanks in an amount not to exceed \$55,990:

Following discussion, Councilman Timm moved to approve Resolution No. 3225 authorizing the City Manager to execute a contract with Cobb, Fendley and Associates, Inc. for water storage tank engineering services necessary to maintain Sachse's 750,000 gallon water tower, 150,000 gallon water tower, and two metal 500,000 gallon ground storage tanks in an amount not to exceed \$55,990. The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith and carried unanimously.

There being no further business, Councilman Patterson moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Councilman Timm and passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 10:11 p.m.
